And the struggles...





Please also be praying for our Ukrainian community - 2 key members of the community have both been diagnosed with cancer this past month - one of them has a sever form that cannot be treated in the Czech Republic. Thankfully a hospital in USA has agreed to treat her at no cost - so a true blessing in time of hardship!
